## DRIVING RANGE RULES

The range will open as soon as the ground is dry enough so that golf balls will not plug. As a rule of thumb, the range is closed when carts must remain on the path only.



Social Members may join the range club for \$125 annual fee.

The range opens daily when the pro shop crew arrives. The range closes **<u>TWO HOURS BEFORE SUNSET</u>** on SUNDAY, TUESDAY & THURSDAY.

The mornings that follow are designated for mowing, therefore, the driving range must be picked clean!

# **JUNIOR GOLF** 2024 OP 36 PROGRAM PGA JUNIOR LEAGUE

OP 36 is back at Lake View CC for a second year. The program was very successful as the kids enjoyed the games and instruction that contributed to their learning experience. The challenge to shoot 36 adds to the fun.

The program runs for eight weeks: one hour class per week, consisting of instruction and games that make practice more enjoyable. Nine-hole rounds are played every other week. All players start at 25 yards from the hole and continue at this yardage until they can score 36 or less. (2023 students will play from the distance they achieved last year). After completing Step 1, players move to 50 yards. Step 3 is 100 yards, Step 4 is 150 yards, Step 5 is 200 yards, etc, until they reach the set of tees they would normally play. Pace of play is maintained with these yardages to under 2 hours. Students can also play on their own and receive points for extra play.

Parents and their kids have an app that provides class information and the student's success rate as it tracks all scores and successful challenges. Learning opportunities such as rules and fitness are also available on the website.

Classes are limited to 6 students. Register on our OP 36 community page: https://operation36golf.com/landing/1984. This year, classes will be based on age and ability when possible. I understand there will be time and family situations. When registering, everyone should sign up for the Monday 4:00 class. We will determine classes after we see the entries. Classes will be on Mondays or Thursdays. Nine-hole rounds will be the opposite day, dates may be adjusted per course availability. **Please register by May 1.** 

Children and grandchildren (age 7-18) of golf and social members are invited to participate. Junior members are also welcome.

A parent meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 9, 6:00 PM, at the club to inform you about the program and answer any questions. Classes begin May 13.

In addition, we will continue the **PGA Junior League Program** for ages 7-13. The League pairs two Lake View players against two players from another club in a 9 hole scramble match play format. Participants play from tees based on age. Matches begin in June and continue until July 31. Matches generally are on weekend afternoons. Teams from Kahkwa, Lake Shore, Culbertson Hills, and possibly Lawrence Park will participate. Registration is now available at: pgajrleague.com. I would also like to have a **14-17 age group** for an in-house PGA Junior League. Kids interested should contact me. Most matches will be at Lake View with the possibility of an away match or two. A minimum of 4 players is required.

Kids may participate in either or both the OP 36 and the PGA Junior League programs. Rates and more detailed information are listed on our website, www.lakeviewcc.com. Click on golf, then junior golf.

# NEW FOR 2024 OP 36 FOR WOMEN

Our Ladies' Academy will be similar to the Junior Program. Eight one hour educational and fun classes will develop the skills required to play on the course. In addition, play nine hole rounds every other week. Everyone begins at 25 yards, shoot 36 or less, and proceed to 50 yards, then 100 yards, etc. The Op 36 App will guide your progress.

I am hoping to do Monday or Thursday Classes depending on interest. Monday afternoons or evenings and Thursdays, 4:00 or earlier are possibilities. We can determine the schedule later. I would like to start approximately the week of May 13. Open to Lake View golf and social members. Limit of six per class. Fees are the same as juniors: \$300 for golf members, \$400 for social members. Everyone should register for the Monday, 6:00 class. We will adjust the classes after we see how many are interested.

# RULES... How to Use the Rules of Golf

The *Rules of Golf* are intended to be comprehensive and provide answers to the many issues that arise in a game that is played worldwide on many different types of courses by players of all abilities.

This *Rules of Golf* book is intended for those who administer the game, and who need to answer the variety of questions that can arise in relation to golf competitions.

When looking to answer a question or resolve a Rules issue on the course, the Contents page (at the front of the book) can be a helpful tool to enable you to find the Rule that is relevant to the situation.

The Index (at the back of the book) can also help you to identify quickly the Rule that is relevant to the situation. For example:

- If a player has accidentally moved their ball on the putting green, identify the key words in the question, such as "ball moved" or "putting green".
- The relevant Rules (Rule 9.4 and Rule 13.1d) can be found under the headings "Ball Moved" and "Putting Green" in the Index.
- A reading of these Rules will confirm the correct answer.

In addition to using the Contents and the Index in the *Rules of Gol*f, the following points will assist you in using this Rule book efficiently and accurately:

#### **Know the Definitions**

There are over 70 defined terms (for example, abnormal course condition, general area, etc.) and these form the foundation around which the Rules are written. A good knowledge of the defined terms (which are italicized

throughout the book and contained in one section near the back of the book) is very important to the correct application of the Rules.

#### The Facts of the Case

To answer any question on the Rules you must consider the facts of the case in some detail. You should identify:

- The form of play (is it match play or stroke play, single, foursome, four-ball, etc.).
- Who is involved (is it the player, partner or caddie, the opponent or their caddie, or an outside influence).
- What area of the course did the incident occur (was it on the teeing area, in a bunker, in a penalty area, on the putting green, etc.).
- What actually happened.
- What were the player's intentions (what was the player doing and what did they want to do).
- The timing of the incident (is the player still on the course, has the player now returned their scorecard, has the competition closed, etc.).

#### **Refer to the Book**

As stated above, reference to the Rule book should provide the answer to the majority of questions that can arise on the course. But to assist referees, Committees and others wanting greater detail, we also publish the Official Guide, which contains Clarifications on the Rules of Golf and Committee Procedures with recommendations on how to organize general play and competitions.
